Your Questions

At Meerkat Central we get asked all sorts of questions from children. Here are the answers to some of them:

- Is it okay to feel happy sometimes when someone is poorly or has died?
- It's a normal and common reaction to sometimes feel happy and do fun things whilst still feeling sad at other times.
- How can I still remember someone special to me after they have died?
- You can share your memories with your family and friends, or you could create a memory box that you can put things in that remind you of your special person. You can also visit places that you went to with them, or listen to their favourite music.
- What do I say if someone asks me about my special person who has died?

- It's normal to feel awkward or upset when someone asks you about your special person who has died. It's okay to say you don't want to talk about it. Most children feel that it gets easier to talk about the more they do it. So if you feel able to talk about it, that's okay too.
- How can I cope with important days without my special person, such as birthdays and Christmas?
- It's normal to worry about how you may feel but everyone feels differently. You could do something to remember them such as buy some flowers, visit a special place, make a card, or talk with others to share memories of your special person.
